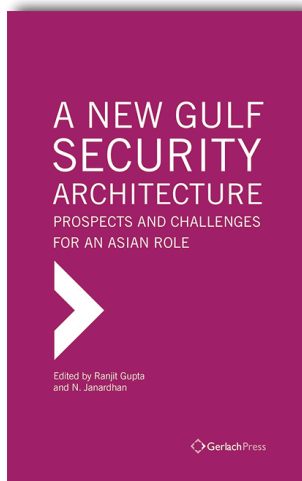


A NEW GULF SECURITY ARCHITECTURE: PROSPECTS AND CHALLENGES FOR AN ASIAN ROLE
