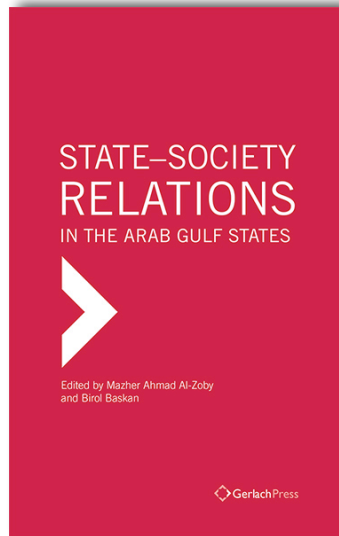
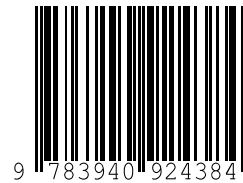


STATE-SOCIETY RELATIONS IN THE ARAB GULF STATES
